



# Class of 84 25th Reunion Golf Tournament September 25th, 2009



### Welcome to the UW Class of 84 - 25<sup>th</sup> Reunion Golf Tournament.

Today's event represents the first time many of us have had a chance to get together in over 25 years. We are likely a little slower and wiser than our days together at the University of Waterloo. Some of us may have taken up the game of golf whereas some of us may have focused more on work, careers and family. As such, today's tournament is a fun day and meant to provide us with the extra incentive to take an extra day off to enjoy our reunion weekend and catch up with long lost classmates.

The planned schedule for the day:

Registration and getting reacquainted: 11:30 am

First Tee-off: 12:30 pm

Socializing and awarding of prizes: 5:00 pm

The organizing committee randomly assigned the foursome as everyone should know each other and if not you should be well acquainted by the end of the round.

Your day will include a round of golf with a cart, BBQ lunch with non-alcoholic drink at the half way house, and snacks following your round. Please hand in your scorecard to the tournament representative in the bar after your round for your post game drinks.

The tournament is a stroke play event, meaning everyone plays their own ball with the following event rules:

- 1. Equal Opportunity: This is an equal opportunity event, plus Doon Valley is a relatively short course, so all players will play from the white tees.
- 2. Social Rule: This is a social event. As such, each member of your group should buy one round drinks during your game for the other members of your group.
- 3. Mulligan's players may purchase mulligan's prior to the start of the round. Mulligans may only be used off the tee. Mulligan's may not be used to win a contest. The player must indicate the hole where a mulligan was applied on their scorecard.
- 4. Putting with the string. Players will receive a 10 foot piece of string with the purchase of a mulligan package. The string may be applied for any putt up to a maximum length of 10 feet or whatever amount of unused string is remaining on their string. One end to the string will have a knot. When using the string for a putt which is left than 10 feet, the player will tie another knot in the string to indicate the remaining amount of string which may be applied for a future putt. Each use of the string counts as 1 putt.
- 5. Relax and have fun Rule if you are 2 over par on a hole (5 on a par 3, 6 on a par 4, 7 on a par 5) and not yet on the green, you may place your ball on the edge of the green and putt; taking no more than 2 putts to complete the hole.

### **Prizes**

Prizes will be awarded to the low gross and low net champions, the most honest golfer and whatever else we wish to award a prize for.

### Fundraising Initiatives

We are using the reunion weekend as a fundraising opportunity to help raise funds for the on-going initiatives at the University of Waterloo. All proceeds from the golf tournament and other weekend events will be donated to UW Math Alumni Development Fund.

You have to opportunity to support the fundraising initiatives by:

- 1. Purchasing a Contest / Mulligan package which will provide you with 1 mulligan on the front nine, one mulligan for the back nine; a 10 foot piece of string which may be applied for putts; and participation in the on course contest. Cost \$20; one per player
- 2. Join the Skins game Players can elect to participate in a skins competition. Low gross score will win a hole and any holes carried over. Any unclaimed carried holes at the end of the tournament will be donated to UW. The amount of skin to be awarded per hole will be dependent on the number of players participating in the skins game. Cost to participate is \$10.
- 3. Best Drive Option: On the five par 5's you may elect to use the location of the best drive from one of the other members of your group or from the current position of the long drive marker on hole #10 as your tee shot. Cost of the Best Drive option is \$10. .
- 4. Purchasing Raffle Tickets: We have collected a few prizes which we will raffle off during the Saturday evening reception. Tickets cost \$20 or 3 for \$40. Some of the prizes include: a VIP Tasting for 10 at Steam Whistle Brewery; LCBO Gift Basket; and a tax receipt for the donation made to the University.

## On Course Contest for Players who purchase of Mulligan package:

- 1. Putting Contest practice green
- 2. Closest to the Pin Hole #4
- 3. Drive and Chip Hole #7
- 4. Long Drive in the fairway (Men/Women) Hole #10
- 5. Closest to the Pin Hole #12

Note: Mulligans or the best drive option can not be used to win a prize on a contest hole or a skin.

### Handicapping

Low net scores will be calculated using the system 36 handicap method. Golfer accrues points based on the following formula: Double bogey or worse - 0 points; Bogey - 1 point; Par or better - 2 points. At the end of the round, points earned are tallied. The total is subtracted from 36, and the resulting number is the golfer's handicap allowance.
